Reflection: Sunday 18th May 2025 Fifth Sunday of Easter

Psalm 148 (See below)

It's not often that we reflect upon the psalms, which is a pity because they are such a storehouse of ways to praise and talk to God. Whatever emotions are uppermost at the time, there's a psalm which reflects those feelings. The mood of the psalmist, often David, goes from despair to elation, hate to love, war to peace, defeat to victory, and then back again. However, he always returns to God, giving thanks and praising him. Apart from being a warrior and eventually a king, David is also a musician and so praises God through his gift, in song accompanied by instruments such as the harp, the lyre and the cymbals.

The psalm for today, 148, is one of the 'Hallelujah' psalms. Hallelujah means 'praise the Lord' and each of the last five psalms begins with these words. The thing I love about these psalms is the joy they express in just being alive. 148 tells so many different things to praise the Lord – few of which can speak!

For David, praising God was not just about singing and he considered that all things glorify God in their own way. The sun praises God by being sunny, the rain praises God by being wet and so on. How can we use our gifts to praise the Lord? Well; our singers sing, our musicians play, our preachers pass on the good news, our gardeners and farmers gladden our hearts by tending to the plants and crops. Some have the gift of cooking, some are attentive listeners, some comforters and some have the gift of prayer. The list is endless because we have each been blessed with different gifts.

This week, think what your gifts are, how you use them. Give thanks to God for them and rejoice. Hallelujah.

1 Alleluia.

Praise the Lord from the heavens; praise him in the heights.

- 2 Praise him, all you his angels; praise him, all his host.
- 3 Praise him, sun and moon; praise him, all you stars of light.
- 4 Praise him, heaven of heavens, and you waters above the heavens.
- 5 Let them praise the name of the Lord, for he commanded and they were created.
- 6 He made them fast for ever and ever; he gave them a law which shall not pass away.
- 7 Praise the Lord from the earth, you sea monsters and all deeps;
- 8 Fire and hail, snow and mist, tempestuous wind, fulfilling his word;
- 9 Mountains and all hills, fruit trees and all cedars;
- 10 Wild beasts and all cattle,
- creeping things and birds on the wing;
- 11 Kings of the earth and all peoples, princes and all rulers of the world;
- 12 Young men and women, old and young together; let them praise the name of the Lord.
- 13 For his name only is exalted, his splendour above earth and heaven.
- 14 He has raised up the horn of his people and praise for all his faithful servants, the children of Israel, a people who are near him. Alleluia.

Bible Readings:

Sunday 18th May

Fifth Sunday of Easter

Acts 11.1-18

11 Now the apostles and the believers who were in Judea heard that the Gentiles had also accepted the word of God.

2 So when Peter went up to Jerusalem, the circumcised believers criticized him,

3 saying, 'Why did you go to uncircumcised men and eat with them?'

4 Then Peter began to explain it to them, step by step, saying,

5 'I was in the city of Joppa praying, and in a trance I saw a vision. There was something like a large sheet coming down from heaven, being lowered by its four corners; and it came close to me.

6 As I looked at it closely I saw four-footed animals, beasts of prey, reptiles, and birds of the air.

7 I also heard a voice saying to me, "Get up, Peter; kill and eat."

8 But I replied, "By no means, Lord; for nothing profane or unclean has ever entered my mouth."

9 But a second time the voice answered from heaven,"What God has made clean, you must not call profane."10 This happened three times; then everything was pulled up again to heaven.

11 At that very moment three men, sent to me from Caesarea, arrived at the house where we were.

12 The Spirit told me to go with them and not to make a distinction between them and us. These six brothers also accompanied me, and we entered the man's house.

13 He told us how he had seen the angel standing in his house and saying, "Send to Joppa and bring Simon, who is called Peter;

14 he will give you a message by which you and your entire household will be saved."

15 And as I began to speak, the Holy Spirit fell upon them just as it had upon us at the beginning.

16 And I remembered the word of the Lord, how he had said, "John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit."

17 If then God gave them the same gift that he gave us when we believed in the Lord Jesus Christ, who was I that I could hinder God?'

18 When they heard this, they were silenced. And they praised God, saying, 'Then God has given even to the Gentiles the repentance that leads to life.'

Revelation 21.1-6

1 Then I saw a new heaven and a new earth; for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away, and the sea was no more.

2 And I saw the holy city, the new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared as a bride adorned for her husband.

3 And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, 'See, the home of God is among mortals. He will dwell with them; they will be his peoples, and God himself will be with them;

4 he will wipe every tear from their eyes. Death will be no more; mourning and crying and pain will be no more, for the first things have passed away.'

5 And the one who was seated on the throne said, 'See, I am making all things new.' Also he said, 'Write this, for these words are trustworthy and true.'

6 Then he said to me, 'It is done! I am the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end. To the thirsty I will give water as a gift from the spring of the water of life.

John 13.31-35

31 When he had gone out, Jesus said, 'Now the Son of Man has been glorified, and God has been glorified in him.

32 If God has been glorified in him, God will also glorify him in himself and will glorify him at once.

33 Little children, I am with you only a little longer. You will look for me; and as I said to the Jews so now I say to you, "Where I am going, you cannot come."

34 I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another.

35 By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another.'

Caring for God's Precious Gift of Creation



Has your church filled in the Energy Footprint Tool (EFT) yet?

The Energy Footprint Tool (EFT) is an easy-to-use online tool that will reveal your church's carbon footprint, based on the energy you use to heat and light your buildings. All the information you need to fill in the EFT can be found on your church energy bills and should take less than an hour to complete.

As well as being of use at a diocesan level, data collected from the tool will help your church understand its own carbon footprint and could result in savings on energy bills. Churches may also be eligible for grants that will help kickstart their carbon reducing projects as we journey together to reach Net Zero Carbon.

Across the Church of England, Leicester is one of 12 dioceses which have achieved over 30% so far. The deadline for completion is 30th June Find out more about the EFT:
