Reflection: Sunday 7th September 2025

Twelfth Sunday after Trinity, Harvest

Thanksgiving

If we are planning to do something like buying a house
or applying for a job or emigrating to a different country,
we have to think very carefully. Our readings today are
telling us that our religion compels us to think just as
carefully about all our decisions about the way we live to
be faithful to our Lord.

Moses at the end of his life summoned the people and
issued a stern challenge. 'God has rescued you from
slavery and led you to a new home which you are about
to enter. You have a choice: obey God and prosper or
disobey the Lord and make a mess of things. Choose life
that you and yours may live.'

Paul gives a similar sort of ultimatum to Philemon, one
of his friends in Colossae: do the Christian thing and take
back Onesimus your slave who has run away, or risk
losing a brother who is truly a useful servant. The
decision may be hard but it will lead to happiness for all.
The challenges that Jesus makes are even more stark:
unless you hate your parents, family, and even yourself,
you cannot be my disciple! Unless you are prepared to
be crucified, you are not following me! He set out to
shock people into remembering his words and to think
hard about their real meaning. In that way his words
became life-transforming, influencing peoples' decisions.
The issue in each of these passages is that people can be
led to find a full and fruitful life if they make the right

decisions – the Israelites under Moses, Philemon and his family, and everyone called to be a disciple of Jesus. All are called to think very carefully about the important decisions in their lives.

For right decisions lead to fulfilment in our lives of faith, and ultimately to the management of the creation entrusted to us. At this Harvest time, let us pray for all making decisions for the welfare of the world.

Twelfth Sunday after Trinity

Deuteronomy 30.15-end

15 See, I have set before you today life and prosperity, death and adversity.

16 If you obey the commandments of the Lord your God that I am commanding you today, by loving the Lord your God, walking in his ways, and observing his commandments, decrees, and ordinances, then you shall live and become numerous, and the Lord your God will bless you in the land that you are entering to possess.

17 But if your heart turns away and you do not hear, but are led astray to bow down to other gods and serve them,

18 I declare to you today that you shall perish; you shall not live long in the land that you are crossing the Jordan to enter and possess.

19 I call heaven and earth to witness against you today that I have set before you life and death, blessings and curses. Choose life so that you and your descendants may live,

20 loving the Lord your God, obeying him, and holding fast to him; for that means life to you and length of days, so that you may live in the land that the Lord swore to give to your ancestors, to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob.

Philemon 1-21

1 Paul, a prisoner of Christ Jesus, and Timothy our brother, To Philemon our dear friend and co-worker,

2 to Apphia our sister, to Archippus our fellow-soldier, and to the church in your house:

3 Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

4 When I remember you in my prayers, I always thank my God

5 because I hear of your love for all the saints and your faith towards the Lord Jesus.

6 I pray that the sharing of your faith may become effective when you perceive all the good that we may do for Christ.

7 I have indeed received much joy and encouragement from your love, because the hearts of the saints have been refreshed through you, my brother.

8 For this reason, though I am bold enough in Christ to command you to do your duty,

9 yet I would rather appeal to you on the basis of love – and I, Paul, do this as an old man, and now also as a prisoner of Christ Jesus.

10 I am appealing to you for my child, Onesimus, whose father I have become during my imprisonment.

11 Formerly he was useless to you, but now he is indeed useful both to you and to me.

12 I am sending him, that is, my own heart, back to you.

13 I wanted to keep him with me, so that he might be of service to me in your place during my imprisonment for the gospel;

14 but I preferred to do nothing without your consent, in order that your good deed might be voluntary and not something forced.

15 Perhaps this is the reason he was separated from you for a while, so that you might have him back for ever,

16 no longer as a slave but as more than a slave, a beloved brother – especially to me but how much more to you, both in the flesh and in the Lord.

17 So if you consider me your partner, welcome him as you would welcome me.

18 If he has wronged you in any way, or owes you anything, charge that to my account.

19 I, Paul, am writing this with my own hand: I will repay it. I say nothing about your owing me even your own self.

20 Yes, brother, let me have this benefit from you in the Lord! Refresh my heart in Christ.

21 Confident of your obedience, I am writing to you, knowing that you will do even more than I say.

Luke 14.25-33

25 Now large crowds were travelling with him; and he turned and said to them,

26 ‘Whoever comes to me and does not hate father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, yes, and even life itself, cannot be my disciple.

27 Whoever does not carry the cross and follow me cannot be my disciple.

28 For which of you, intending to build a tower, does not first sit down and estimate the cost, to see whether he has enough to complete it?

29 Otherwise, when he has laid a foundation and is not able to finish, all who see it will begin to ridicule him,

30 saying, “This fellow began to build and was not able to finish.”

31 Or what king, going out to wage war against another king, will not sit down first and consider whether he is able with ten thousand to oppose the one who comes against him with twenty thousand?

32 If he cannot, then, while the other is still far away, he sends a delegation and asks for the terms of peace.

33 So therefore, none of you can become my disciple if you do not give up all your possessions.

1st September to 4th October

Creationtide, or the Season of Creation, is dedicated to God as Creator and Sustainer of Life. It is a month of unity, when Christians around the world celebrate the beauty and wonder of creation and commit to caring for our common home.

This year, we are called to be peacemakers with creation, all people and God, based on Isaiah 32:14-18.

The prophet Isaiah pictured the desolated Creation without peace because of the lack of justice and the broken relationship between people and God.

This description of devastated cities and wastelands reveals how human destructive behaviours have a negative impact on the Earth.

Our hope: Creation will find peace when justice is restored. There is still hope and the expectation for a peaceful Earth. To hope does not mean to stand still and quiet, but to act, pray, change, and reconcile with Creation and the Creator in unity, repentance and solidarity.

Care for God's creation is part of our everyday faith as Christians. We honour God when we care for his creation. We show love to our neighbours, near and far, when we care about the environments in which they live. And we work for justice when we seek to tackle climate change and halt the loss of nature.

During Creationtide, that call feels all the more significant and is a great time to start, or expand upon our eco-conscious endeavours.
