Reflection: Sunday 15th June 2025 **Trinity Sunday**

It seems strange to be approaching the season of Trinity, ordinary time the lectionary calls it, before the year is half over, because the next season is Advent, then Christmas and our calendar year is gone!

The Holy Trinity, which we celebrate this Sunday, can be as a wise and far reaching guide for our lives, if we let it. It's how Christians understand who God is. Every act of Christian worship is rooted in our belief in that there is one God existing in three persons: the Father, the Son Jesus and the Holy Spirit.

That makes the Trinity season the framework for everything else and the Church's calendar is shaped around the work of the Trinity.

Advent (the beginning of the church's year) and Christmas focus on the Father sending the Son.

Lent and Easter focus on Jesus' mission, death, and resurrection.

Pentecost focuses on the Holy Spirit being sent to empower the Church.

Then comes Trinity Sunday, which brings it all together. The weeks of the Trinity are generally when we learn about the teaching and miracles of Jesus and how to live out our faith.

The Trinity is the perfect example of Father, Son, and Holy Spirit working together in harmony, a model for us to practice love, compassion, and cooperation in the ways we connect with others.

The different persons of the Trinity show us the importance of community, connection, understanding, support and mutual respect.

The Holy Spirit is the presence of God within us, it can guide our decisions, inspire us to act kindly, and support our spiritual growth.

Our blessings are always given in the name of the God Almighty, Father, Son and Holy Spirit to remind us of the core of our belief - three in one and one in three.

Trinity Sunday

Proverbs 8.1-4, 22-31

- 1 Does not wisdom call, and does not understanding raise her voice?
- 2 On the heights, beside the way, at the crossroads she takes her stand;
- 3 beside the gates in front of the town, at the entrance of the portals she cries out:
- 4 'To you, O people, I call, and my cry is to all that live.
- 22 The Lord created me at the beginning of his work, the first of his acts of long ago.
- 23 Ages ago I was set up, at the first, before the beginning of the earth.
- 24 When there were no depths I was brought forth, when there were no springs abounding with water.

1 Therefore, since we are justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ,

- 4 and endurance produces character, and character produces hope,

Diocesan Synod Summary - May 2025

A meeting of the Diocesan Synod took place on Saturday 17 May at St Martins House in Leicester, with an agenda that covered a range of topics including finance, education, and safeguarding. Bishop Martyn's Presidential Address highlighted positive signs of reversing church decline, emphasising our Intergenerational Communities strategic priority and plans for intergenerational hubs to encourage lifelong discipleship in young people.

During a presentation from the Diocesan Board of Education (DBE), Tracey Manns, deputy director, elaborated on the DBE's vision to transform the lives of children and young people through effective, distinctive, rooted, and inclusive education. She noted that while schools often focus on results, behaviour, and attendance, the DBE emphasises renewing the mind (Romans 12:2),

character development based on Christian values, holistic pupil development, and daily collective worship to help students experience the Kingdom of God.

Questions from the floor were challenging, particularly around finance and Minster Communities, and in addressing the future, Bishop Martyn said that our hope is in God and comes from prayer and worship. Speakers also highlighted the need to increase congregation numbers and giving in churches.

Journeying with the Psalms through Life's Ups and Downs

St Dionysius traditionally makes much of their choir at services such as Nine Lessons & Carols, and their Easter Vigil, but saw an opportunity to create an event for the summer.

"I have often been struck by the honesty of the psalms and how they bring voice to both the ups and downs of life." explains Revd Phil. "The idea developed for a service that journeys through the different forms of psalms. I thought it could be a powerful act of gathered worship and provide an opportunity for the special involvement of the choir." Revd Phil worked with Pam Abbott, the choir coordinator and Jane Holyland, one of their organists, to set out a journey through the psalms that marks different tones; those that cry out in lament, those that are reflective, and those that are joyous – including an acclamation of God as creator of the world.

"Although the psalms are ancient texts, and the specific contexts in which they were written vary from our own contexts, there is nevertheless a commonality that resonates," says Revd Phil. "The sense of crying out to God in the midst of personal struggles and at the injustices in the world around is relevant today, and indeed throughout history. Similarly, the more joyous notes of thanksgiving and exultation are relatable even if the specific context is different."

The team are hopeful that through the readings, liturgy, music and silence there will be space for people to come to God with whatever is going on in their lives and the wider world
