Reflection: Sunday 24th August 2025

Tenth Sunday after Trinity

Luke 13: 10-17

Have you ever talked to someone and realised they just haven't 'got it'? My wife says she often feels like that when she's talking to me! This is what this story is about, a religious leader so engrossed in being outwardly religious that he'd forgotten that being religious means 'being' something rather than just 'doing' something. Jesus saw right through him, grumbling that his perceived perception of religiosity was violated, while the woman who'd been wretched with back problems for 18 years, was healed, and immediately began to praise God. Note how the woman followed the true reason for the sabbath by praising God when she was healed, while the religious leader just grumbled that

healing the sick was a Monday to Saturday job. Jesus exposes the ridiculous nature of this argument by reminding him that watering animals on the sabbath was work yet they did it to save their livestock, how much more important was the healing of this woman. No wonder Luke tells us that the synagogue leaders were embarrassed, while the ordinary people rejoiced. The challenge of this reading to us is to remember that there is more to being Christian than going to church and being seen to do the right things.

who are deaf, yet have ears!
9 Let all the nations gather together,
and let the peoples assemble. Who among them

and foretold to us the former things? Let them bring
their witnesses to justify them,
and let them hear and say, 'It is true.'
10 You are my witnesses, says the Lord,
and my servant whom I have chosen, so that you may
know and believe me
and understand that I am he. Before me no god was
formed,
nor shall there be any after me.
11 I, I am the Lord,
and besides me there is no saviour.
12 I declared and saved and proclaimed,
when there was no strange god among you;
and you are my witnesses, says the Lord.
13 I am God, and also henceforth I am He;
there is no one who can deliver from my hand;
I work and who can hinder it?

Acts 5.12-16

12 Now many signs and wonders were done among the
people through the apostles. And they were all together
in Solomon's Portico.
13 None of the rest dared to join them, but the people
held them in high esteem.
14 Yet more than ever believers were added to the
Lord, great numbers of both men and women,
15 so that they even carried out the sick into the
streets, and laid them on cots and mats, in order that
Peter's shadow might fall on some of them as he came
by.
16 A great number of people would also gather from the
towns around Jerusalem, bringing the sick and those
tormented by unclean spirits, and they were all cured.

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Or:

1 Corinthians 4.9-15

9 For I think that God has exhibited us apostles as last of
all, as though sentenced to death, because we have
become a spectacle to the world, to angels and to
mortals.

10 We are fools for the sake of Christ, but you are wise
in Christ. We are weak, but you are strong. You are held
in honour, but we in disrepute.

11 To the present hour we are hungry and thirsty, we
are poorly clothed and beaten and homeless,

12 and we grow weary from the work of our own hands.
When reviled, we bless; when persecuted, we endure;

13 when slandered, we speak kindly. We have become
like the rubbish of the world, the dregs of all things, to
this very day.

14 I am not writing this to make you ashamed, but to
admonish you as my beloved children.

15 For though you might have ten thousand guardians
in Christ, you do not have many fathers. Indeed, in Christ
Jesus I became your father through the gospel.

Luke 22.24-30

24 A dispute also arose among them as to which one of
them was to be regarded as the greatest.

25 But he said to them, 'The kings of the Gentiles lord it
over them; and those in authority over them are called
benefactors.

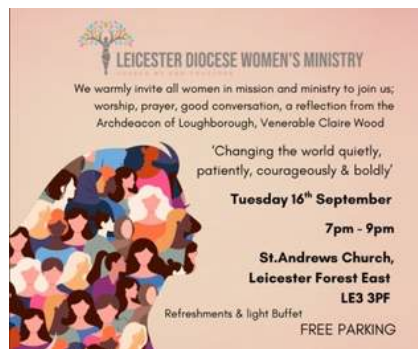
26 But not so with you; rather the greatest among you
must become like the youngest, and the leader like one
who serves.

27 For who is greater, the one who is at the table or the
one who serves? Is it not the one at the table? But I am
among you as one who serves.

28 'You are those who have stood by me in my trials;

on me, a kingdom,

30 so that you may eat and drink at my table in my
kingdom, and you will sit on thrones judging the twelve
tribes of Israel.

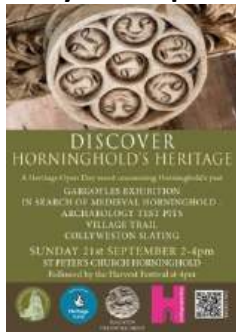

Generosity Week is a celebration of God's generosity that is lived out in our churches and parishes. It gives us an opportunity to engage with and support the wider community as we celebrate the generosity found. This isn't a celebration of 'our' generosity but God's, which is found within the church and outside it.

To start planning and promoting Generosity Week, take these three steps:

1. **Pick a week** – the national week runs from **Sunday 28 September to Sunday 5 October** but if another time works better for you, do it then.
2. Choose what to do – think what your church needs and look through the resources available (see below).
3. Plan your Sundays – two Sundays works well as it gives you one chance to explore gratitude and one to consider generosity. To get you started, there are service outlines, sermon starters and prayers – all generosity themed.

Some people who serve as Focal Ministers will, like Hilary, be existing licensed Associate Ministers; but others may not and the diocese is committed to enabling them to be recognised, authorised and supported as spiritual leaders in their parishes.
