Reflection: Sunday 14th September 2025 Thirteenth Sunday after Trinity

Luke 15: 1-10

I don't know about you, but I can really relate to this reading. You realise something is missing, some keys or a book say, and it's not where you thought it was. So, you immediately stop what you are doing and conduct a search, and the keys turn up down the sofa, or the book has fallen behind the shelf etc. And that feeling of joy and relief you feel when you have found that item, like the shepherd of the lost sheep or the woman with the lost coin. I don't know if I would throw a party to celebrate but I suspect Jesus was using this to highlight the depth of emotion.

God, Jesus is saying to the Pharisees and the teachers of the law is like that when people who are not righteous repent and turn away from their past lives and start to live to please him. That sense of joy at finding your lost keys or lost book pales into insignificance in comparison. Dealing with new converts to Christianity who come from very different backgrounds and life styles can be hard, but when we struggle we need to remember this passage.

Sunday 14th September 2025

Thirteenth Sunday after Trinity

Exodus 32.7-14

7 The Lord said to Moses, 'Go down at once! Your people, whom you brought up out of the land of Egypt, have acted perversely;

8 they have been quick to turn aside from the way that I commanded them; they have cast for themselves an image of a calf, and have worshipped it and sacrificed to it, and said, "These are your gods, O Israel, who brought you up out of the land of Egypt!"'

9 The Lord said to Moses, 'I have seen this people, how stiff-necked they are.

10 Now let me alone, so that my wrath may burn hot against them and I may consume them; and of you I will make a great nation.'

11 But Moses implored the Lord his God, and said, 'O Lord, why does your wrath burn hot against your people, whom you brought out of the land of Egypt with great power and with a mighty hand?

12 Why should the Egyptians say, "It was with evil intent that he brought them out to kill them in the mountains, and to consume them from the face of the earth"? Turn from your fierce wrath; change your mind and do not bring disaster on your people.

13 Remember Abraham, Isaac, and Israel, your servants, how you swore to them by your own self, saying to them, "I will multiply your descendants like the stars of heaven, and all this land that I have promised I will give to your descendants, and they shall inherit it for ever."'

14 And the Lord changed his mind about the disaster that he planned to bring on his people.

1 Timothy 1.12-17

12 I am grateful to Christ Jesus our Lord, who has strengthened me, because he judged me faithful and appointed me to his service,

13 even though I was formerly a blasphemer, a persecutor, and a man of violence. But I received mercy because I had acted ignorantly in unbelief,

14 and the grace of our Lord overflowed for me with the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus.

15 The saying is sure and worthy of full acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners-of whom I am the foremost.

16 But for that very reason I received mercy, so that in me, as the foremost, Jesus Christ might display the utmost patience, making me an example to those who would come to believe in him for eternal life.

17 To the King of the ages, immortal, invisible, the only God, be honour and glory for ever and ever. Amen.

Luke 15.1-10

15 Now all the tax-collectors and sinners were coming near to listen to him.

2 And the Pharisees and the scribes were grumbling and saying, 'This fellow welcomes sinners and eats with them.'

3 So he told them this parable:

4 'Which one of you, having a hundred sheep and losing one of them, does not leave the ninety-nine in the wilderness and go after the one that is lost until he finds it?

5 When he has found it, he lays it on his shoulders and rejoices.

6 And when he comes home, he calls together his friends and neighbours, saying to them, "Rejoice with me, for I have found my sheep that was lost."

7 Just so, I tell you, there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous people who need no repentance.

8 'Or what woman having ten silver coins, if she loses one of them, does not light a lamp, sweep the house, and search carefully until she finds it?

9 When she has found it, she calls together her friends and neighbours, saying, "Rejoice with me, for I have found the coin that I had lost."

10 Just so, I tell you, there is joy in the presence of the angels of God over one sinner who repents.'

Food Bank Appeal:

Our Churches continue to support local Foodbanks.

Jubilee Foodbank Market Harborough You can drop off donations at **Hallaton Church** or to Linda Jones at **25, Eastgate, Hallaton at any time**. Please note that all food collected is non-perishable, long-life or tinned.

The Foodbank has **MOST URGENT NEED of:**

Fray Bentos pies, UHT milk (whole or semi-skimmed), Pasta sauce, Corned beef, Tinned ham, Crackers.

They also need:

Tinned soup, Cup of soup, Custard, Coffee (small jars), Sugar (500g), Tinned potatoes, Tinned sausages with beans, Tinned rice pudding, Microwave rice, Tinned peas, Tinned ham, Tinned fruit, Marmalade, Tinned vegetarian meals, such as veggie chilli, Meals that do not need cooking e.g. John West Fish and rice meals, Biscuits, Snacks and cereal bars, Fruit squash/ juice, Hot dogs (tins or jars), Red meat: mince, stew, Bolognese, chilli, Microwave puddings, Pasta sauce, Peanut butter, Chicken in sauce, Tinned carrots, Tinned pasta, Dried potatoes (Smash), Tinned sweetcorn, Tinned tomatoes, Sandwich paste, Teabags, Tuna, ALPRO yoghurts (long-life, for the shelf not fridge), Long-life meals, Robinsons minis or similar for families (small squash concentrates), Small cartons of long life milk (for homeless people or someone without a fridge)

Creationtide – Peace with creation

1st September to 4th October

Creationtide, or the Season of Creation, is dedicated to God as Creator and Sustainer of Life. It is a month of unity, when Christians around the world celebrate the beauty and wonder of creation and commit to caring for our common home.

This year, we are called to be peacemakers with creation, all people and God, based on Isaiah 32:14-18.

The prophet Isaiah pictured the desolated Creation without peace because of the lack of justice and the broken relationship between people and God.

This description of devastated cities and wastelands reveals how human destructive behaviours have a negative impact on the Earth.

Our hope: Creation will find peace when justice is restored. There is still hope and the expectation for a peaceful Earth. To hope does not mean to stand still and quiet, but to act, pray, change, and reconcile with Creation and the Creator in unity, repentance and solidarity.

Care for God's creation is part of our everyday faith as Christians. We honour God when we care for his creation. We show love to our neighbours, near and far, when we care about the environments in which they live. And we work for justice when we seek to tackle climate change and

halt the loss of nature.

During Creationtide, that call feels all the more significant and is a great time to start, or expand upon our eco-conscious endeavours.
