Have Minster Community-wide giving/ Stewardship campaign Reestablish ourselves as a Benefice as through interregnum Now we are at a crossroads this creates the opportunity to look at patterns of worship differently To engage more with our local community Leadership organising services and ministry across all the parishes Opportunity of moving around to other parishes. Shared services could offer Holy Communion for more people People to travel and mix in fellowship. Developments of relationships with families, baptisms, weddings etc
 One concern? Message of Minster Community needs promoting Will people travel? Our concern is the loss of a service every Sunday so fewer would attend church. Only a few would go to another village. If local church has no service it will close Stress on Oversight Minister That we are becoming a much less sacramental church Maintenance of buildings. Seasonal challenges Small congregation Not everyone is Church of England Expanding financial demands on congregations 	 One hope? Greater awareness of pastoral needs Draw in younger people - as we are getting old Our Benefice has a history of working together and we can build on that Developing a missional strategy of growth and renewal Our young people through our schools. One hope is that our retired priests keep going! God is on the throne and loves His church Our hope is that we can attract more people and therefore maintain weekly services That churches who currently only have one or two services per month would be more enthused to engage in "self led" services
