Reflection: 29th December 2024

First Sunday after Christmas

Just under a week ago, the church celebrated the birth of the Christ child; His coming was the fulfilment of God's promise of a Messiah.

Now, a few days later, our Gospel reading tells us of the 12-year-old Jesus. How time flies!

But how little we know of Jesus' childhood and early manhood. We note a record of his circumcision and presentation to the Lord (Luke Ch 2). We know that Joseph was a carpenter/mason in Nazareth, and that ultimately Jesus would have four brothers and at least two sisters (Matthew 13). But there is little else – no detail of the 'wondrous childhood' mentioned in the carol 'Once in Royal David's city'.

Today we read of Jesus in the temple, at the feast of unleavened bread, with his parents, fulfilling the law that adult males should attend three feasts annually; Unleavened Bread, Harvest and Tabernacles (Exodus 23).

That visit to the temple reveals something of a family drama. Following the feast, Jesus' parents depart without him. One can imagine their reaction and feelings when they realise that He is not with them or their party. Anger, worry, guilt? However, they do find him, still in the temple listening to the teachers. To his distressed parents, he says 'Didn't you know I had to be in my Father's house?' Here is the young Jesus, embracing His calling as God's Son, declaring His vocation to make God's ways known and to begin the building of God's kingdom.

Yes, we may have little knowledge of his early life, but we recognise that we are not to live looking to the past, but to live in Him, as he leads us on to the future, into the fulfilment of God's promises and purposes and to His coming again.

First Sunday after Christmas

1 Samuel 2.18-20, 26

18 Samuel was ministering before the Lord, a boy wearing a linen ephod.

19 His mother used to make for him a little robe and take it to him each year, when she went up with her husband to offer the yearly sacrifice.

20 Then Eli would bless Elkanah and his wife, and say, 'May the Lord repay you with children by this woman for the gift that she made to the Lord'; and then they would return to their home.

26 Now the boy Samuel continued to grow both in stature and in favour with the Lord and with the people.

Colossians 3.12-17

12 As God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience.

13 Bear with one another and, if anyone has a complaint against another, forgive each other; just as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive.

14 Above all, clothe yourselves with love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony.

15 And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in the one body. And be thankful.

16 Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly; teach and admonish one another in all wisdom; and with gratitude in your hearts sing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs to God.

17 And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him.

Luke 2.41-end

41 Now every year his parents went to Jerusalem for the festival of the Passover.

42 And when he was twelve years old, they went up as usual for the festival.

43 When the festival was ended and they started to return, the boy Jesus stayed behind in Jerusalem, but his parents did not know it.

44 Assuming that he was in the group of travellers, they went a day's journey. Then they started to look for him among their relatives and friends.

45 When they did not find him, they returned to Jerusalem to search for him.

46 After three days they found him in the temple, sitting among the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions.

47 And all who heard him were amazed at his understanding and his answers.

48 When his parents saw him they were astonished; and his mother said to him, 'Child, why have you treated us like this? Look, your father and I have been searching for you in great anxiety.'

49 He said to them, 'Why were you searching for me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?'

50 But they did not understand what he said to them.

51 Then he went down with them and came to Nazareth, and was obedient to them. His mother treasured all these things in her heart.

52 And Jesus increased in wisdom and in years, and in divine and human favour.

Isaiah 52.7-10

7 How beautiful upon the mountains
are the feet of the messenger who announces peace,
who brings good news,
who announces salvation,
who says to Zion, 'Your God reigns.'
8 Listen! Your sentinels lift up their voices,
together they sing for joy; for in plain sight they see
the return of the Lord to Zion.
9 Break forth together into singing,
you ruins of Jerusalem; for the Lord has comforted his
people,
he has redeemed Jerusalem.
10 The Lord has bared his holy arm
before the eyes of all the nations; and all the ends of
the earth shall see
the salvation of our God.

Hebrews 1.1-4 5-12

1 Long ago God spoke to our ancestors in many and
various ways by the prophets,
2 but in these last days he has spoken to us by a Son,
whom he appointed heir of all things, through whom he
also created the worlds.
3 He is the reflection of God's glory and the exact
imprint of God's very being, and he sustains all things by
his powerful word. When he had made purification for
sins, he sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on
high,
4 having become as much superior to angels as the
name he has inherited is more excellent than theirs.
5 For to which of the angels did God ever say, 'You are
my Son;
today I have begotten you'? Or again, 'I will be his
Father,
and he will be my Son'?
6 And again, when he brings the firstborn into the
world, he says, 'Let all God's angels worship him.'
7 Of the angels he says, 'He makes his angels winds,
and his servants flames of fire.'
8 But of the Son he says, 'Your throne, O God, is for ever
and ever,
and the righteous sceptre is the sceptre of your
kingdom.
9 You have loved righteousness and hated wickedness;
therefore God, your God, has anointed you
with the oil of gladness beyond your companions.'
10 And, 'In the beginning, Lord, you founded the earth,
and the heavens are the work of your hands;
11 they will perish, but you remain;
they will all wear out like clothing;
12 like a cloak you will roll them up,
and like clothing they will be changed. But you are the
same,
and your years will never end.'

John 1.1-14

1 In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with
God, and the Word was God.
2 He was in the beginning with God.
3 All things came into being through him, and without
him not one thing came into being. What has come into
being
4 in him was life, and the life was the light of all people.
5 The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did
not overcome it.
6 There was a man sent from God, whose name was
John.
7 He came as a witness to testify to the light, so that all
might believe through him.
8 He himself was not the light, but he came to testify to
the light.
9 The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming
into the world.
10 He was in the world, and the world came into being
through him; yet the world did not know him.
11 He came to what was his own, and his own people
did not accept him.
12 But to all who received him, who believed in his
name, he gave power to become children of God,
13 who were born, not of blood or of the will of the
flesh or of the will of man, but of God.
14 And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and
we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only
son, full of grace and truth.

As the shape of ministry changes across our diocese, many people are feeling called to offer spiritual leadership in their local church.

Focal Ministry is the name being given to this emerging form of ministry, which involves enabling prayer and worship, encouraging others in deepening their faith and equipping local churches to bless their communities.

The role of a Focal Minister is to offer spiritual leadership to a local church or benefice. They are faithful people who are:

- **Rooted** in their community
- The **visible** face of the church
- **Fruitful** in encouraging the growth of faith and gifts in others.

Liz Rawlings, our Discipleship and Vocations Enabler, has been reflecting on what she has been noticing, and explains: "As I have travelled around the diocese, I have met a number of people offering local leadership in their churches, enabling prayer and worship, building faith in others and connecting the church with the community.

"It seems that God is at work growing local spiritual leaders and it's inspiring to hear their stories. Our task now is to serve and support this ministry and share what the Spirit is doing among us."
